**2:35 Presentation: Prenatal Care, Preterm Birth, and Racial Disparities among Low-Income White and Black Mothers in Sacramento County, California – *Jamie White, Sacramento Public Health***

An analysis of Sacramento birth data showed that preterm birth (PTB) was higher for Blacks than Whites, despite the fact that low-income Black females had greater geographic access to, and utilization of prenatal care (PNC), than low-income White females. Binary logistic regression and attributable risk fractions were used to explore the relationship between PTB and PNC. Results revealed that early and adequate PNC is necessary but not sufficient for reducing racial disparities in PTB in Sacramento County.

**3:30 Presentation: Residential Mobility, Displacement, and Train Station Openings – *Dr. Marlon Boarnet and Seva Rodnyansky, Sol Price School of Public Policy, University of Southern California***

Residential instability, including moving often and moving far away, has been shown to have adverse effects on health, wellness, and educational outcomes for children, low-income households, and minority populations. This research looks at whether new public investment in the form of new rail transit stations spurs displacement of existing lower-income households from their neighborhoods, thereby increasing instability. The project examines a 20-year period (1993-2013) in Los Angeles County using an innovative administrative tax dataset.
